
AYR, ST ANDREW'S CHURCH

SUNDAY

"The Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ her Lord;" as we gather in his presence again today thank God for the gift of life. Pray that wherever God's people gather in worship globally, that they may encounter God's divine presence and be transformed to conform to his divine nature. Please pray for Stanley our minister, the worship team and everyone working at the background to ensure that Sunday by Sunday we are led in worship bringing to life the presence and promises of God.

MONDAY

Many parts of the world have suffered the effect of natural disaster. Pray for all who are affected by natural disasters, from bush fires and plagues to floods and devastating mudslides that destroy homes and livelihoods, putting lives at risk. Pray that people living through these difficult times would find comfort and hope in the Lord. May help get to those affected at just the right time.

TUESDAY

Across the world both in developed and developing countries nations are confronted with conflict and political instability. Pray for all the countries that are going through conflict and political instability. Whether in Ukraine or Syria or Afghanistan or Sri Lanka or any part of Africa or here at home. Pray for peace, and that citizen's be free from fear and know stability once more.

WEDNESDAY

Jesus says, we his church are in the world but not of the world. Give God thanks, praise him, for his Church across the globe. Ask God to work through the church to set people free from the chains of spiritual and material poverty for his glory. There's so much pain and suffering in our present world. Ask God to intervene; with him all things are possible. No problem is too big or small for our sovereign God.

THURSDAY

Jesus says, "Peace, I leave with you; *my peace I give you*. I do not give to you as the world gives" Jn 14:27. Thank God for his promise that one day there will be no more tears, no more heartbreak. Until that day, let us pray for God's continued grace and goodness to overflow in this world. prayer for world peace. Pray that countries find diplomatic solutions to issues. Pray that if it be the will of God let wars and unrest cease.

FRIDAY

It is not the wish of God for any soul to perish. Let us cry out to God to save the Lost. Pray for a world that doesn't know God. let healing and revival sweep across the length and breadth of our contemporary world. Ask God to allow you to be a source of his light to those who need him. Pray for divine appointments all across the world today. Pray for the world to know God. In Jesus' name, Amen. (*Read: 1 Timothy 2:1–7*) Again, remember that you are one our Lord Jesus Christ has mandated to go and preach the good news. Why not start with your neighbour today.

SATURDAY

We are told in Philippians 4:6 to "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God." Today bring that burden for physical illness, for mental illness, for broken families, for Poverty, for Justice, etc before God. Ask God to intervene and show himself strong. Pray for Ayr, St Andrew's Church that a door for spiritual, numerical, and financial increase be opened for us. Pray for peace and success of the Ayr Presbytery Citation meeting on 23rd August. With thanksgiving to God pray for St Andrew's, Auld Kirk, and St Columba Churches that our coming together in the future would be a smooth transition. Ask to direct and lead in every step of the process.

Dominion

In the first chapter of Genesis, God told Adam to dominate this earth—take dominion over it and subdue it. This was not only for the earth, but also for all that was in it. In other words, if anything got out of line, Adam was to put it back in line. This was Adam's responsibility, but he didn't do what God commanded. He turned his authority over to the evil one. He bowed his knee to an outlaw spirit.
