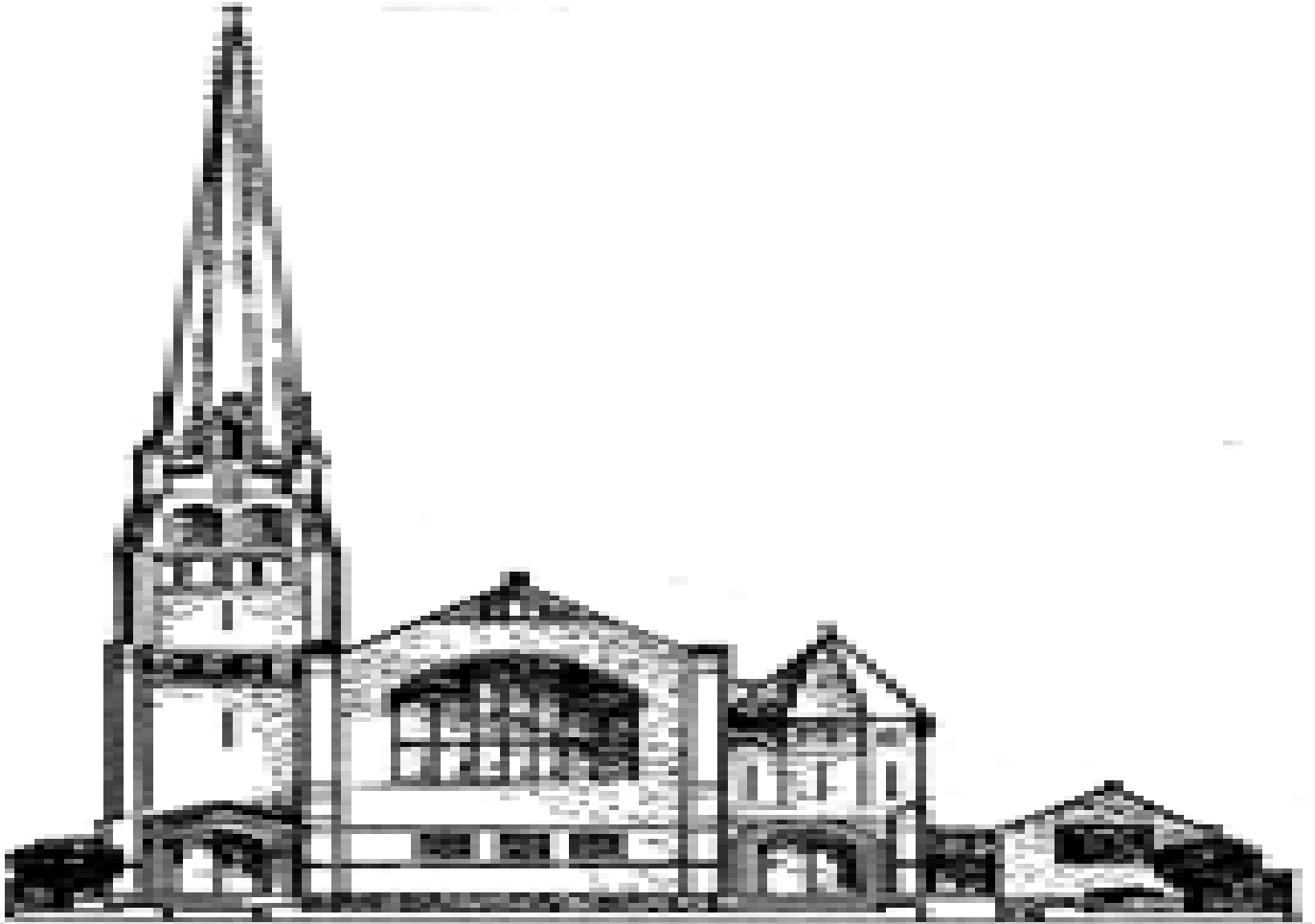

SUNDAY

As we gather in his presence again today thank God for the gift of life. Pray that wherever God's people gather in worship globally, that they may encounter God's divine presence and be transformed to conform to his divine nature. Please pray for Stanley our minister, the worship team and everyone working at the background to ensure that Sunday by Sunday we are led in worship bringing to life the presence and promises of God.

MONDAY

The tension between Christians and Muslims around the world is daily increasing, be it in Nigeria, Sri Lanka, Iran, Pakistan, etc. Ask God to pour forth his divine light upon our world, quelling the rising tensions between people of different faiths. Pray that people of different religions may embrace compassion, understanding, and unity, transcending differences. That love replaces fear and may dialogue replace conflict. Ask God to grant different faiths wisdom to see the common threads that bind us all, and the courage to stand against prejudice and hatred. May God bring tranquillity to our troubled world, healing wounds and fostering harmony between Christians and Muslims.

TUESDAY

Give thanks for the mission and work of Auld Kirk, St Columba, and Ayr St Andrew's Congregations. As we continue working together to becoming one, ask God to guide the work we do in our community. May he Grant us strength, wisdom, and compassion as we serve those in need. May our efforts bring hope, healing, and positive change to the lives we touch. Ask God to bless our endeavours with unity and understanding, that we may spread his love and light to every corner.

WEDNESDAY

Today as we pray for the world's economy let us give thanks to God for his blessings upon our world. Pray and ask God for guidance and grace in the midst of global economic turmoil. Ask God to ease the burdens of struggling nations, families, and individuals. Ask God to grant us all resilience, creativity, and a shared commitment to rebuild a stable world. May compassion and cooperation prevail over uncertainty. Ask God to bless us with hope and wisdom as we navigate these challenging times.

THURSDAY

Praise God for his love, goodness and mercy endures forever. Today, ask God to surround you and your loved ones with his favour like a shield. Ask God to open doors of opportunity for you and everyone in need according to Psalm 5:12. Pray for God's protection and safety throughout August. Ask God to Keep you and your loved ones secure from all harm and danger, in Jesus' name (Psalm 121:7). May God's love and peace reign in our homes, and may our relationships be filled with harmony and understanding, in the name of Jesus. (Psalm 133:1).

FRIDAY

Thank God for our congregation – Ayr St Andrew's Church. We are in the position to remind ourselves that, the harvest is many, but labourers are few. Ask the Lord to send labourers who will support the mission of our congregation. Pray for different groups within the congregation – Messy Church, Women group, Prayer/Bible Study group, Men Fellowship, Boy's Brigade, etc. Ask God to send revival upon us and everything we do. Ask God to revival our giving and our receiving.

SATURDAY

We are told in Philippians 4:6 to “Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God.” Today let us lift our prayers before God: pray for physical or/and mental healing over people you know and those you not know that are sick. Pray for healing over broken families. Pray for people living in poverty and for those justice has been denied. Ask God to intervene and show himself strong.
